

## Name That Seabird Activity Sheet

Match the name of the seabirds found on the Otago Peninsula listed below with their description!

I am black and white, I nest in colonies for safety, and my name highlights the region of New Zealand where I live!

I have a brightly coloured bill and feet, my favourite lunch is krill, and I am considered to be more threatened than Northern Royal Albatross!

I am the only blue species of my kind, I nest in underground burrows or boxes, and although I am small I can lay up to four eggs in a single year!

I am black and white, I have a long scoop shaped bill to forage in inlets, I nest in the tops of trees, and I am a wading bird with long legs!

I am dark in colour, I nest in underground burrows which I return to at night, and I can dive over 20 metres below the surface for fish!

I am white with black on my wings, I have the largest wingspan of any seabird, and my bill is hooked to hold my favourite snack – slippery squid!

I have green around my eyes when I am breeding, I have tiny spots on my feathers, and I build my nest on a tiny ledge on a steep cliff face!

I have a bright coloured band around my head, short stubby wings, and I can hold my breath for almost four minutes!

I am small and mostly black, I have black feet and a short stubby yellow bill, I dive for fish, and I like to sit on top of boat sheds!
